

The Episcopal Network for Economic Justice has hired Martha Gardner as its interim coordinator. Gardner will replace Michael Maloney of Cincinnati who has served as ENEJ staff since 2001. Gardner takes up the coordinator position February 1 and is eligible for the permanent position. Gardner will work from her home office in Maplewood, New Jersey, where she is active in the Diocese of Newark serving on the Standing Committee, Women's Commission, as Jubilee Officer and Diocesan ERD Coordinator. She serves the Episcopal Church as a member of the Executive Council.
